



Cambridge Health Network (CHN) was set up by Pam Garside and Penny Dash, with support from the Judge Business School, in June 2004 with following objectives:

- Provide a forum for leading players in health to meet informally
- Build a group where ideas can be conceived, developed and nurtured
- Provide a focus to share experiences, ideas, proposals
- Build a link between the research and teaching facilities at the Judge Business School and the health industry

The purpose of the Network is to bring together leaders from the NHS and private healthcare providers (including many of the recent new entrants to the market); pharmaceutical, medical devices and biotechnology companies; retail organisations; IT, search and selection and consulting firms; think tanks and academia; and the leading financiers of health and healthcare companies.

We have over 1000 members.

The Cambridge Health Network requires funding to support the management of events and catering where the host organisation is unable to provide it. We are very grateful to BUPA, GSK, Halliburton, Monitor, Mott Macdonald, GE, Carillion, Assura, Map of Medicine and Dell Perot Systems who have acted as sponsors to date.

Since 2004 we have had up to 8 very successful events a year, with an outstanding line up of speakers.
